

A VIEW of Dover Coastguard Station: The site

Direction / Instruction	Question / Look out for...
<p>You are outside of the station entrance... Look around. The station entrance/exit is to your right and the weather station is to your left. Rotate left to face just a little south of east. Move forward (east) Look around. .. Rotate to face north west Move forward (west) to return to the entrance. Facing north-west Move forward (north-west) and up the hill. Look around... Facing south west Move forward (south west) own the hill Look around...</p> <p>Facing east Move forward (east) back towards the station entrance. Rotate right to face south Click on the entrance to the station and go inside...</p>	<p>...Notice the radar above the entrance.</p> <p>... Find out more about the Dover Strait and use the timeline to see an aerial view and old construction photographs.</p> <p>... notice the route to the helicopter pad.</p> <p>... checkout the Dover harbour hot spot, the timelines and a little history and information about the Dover strait and the purpose behind much of the activity of the station.</p> <p>...The reception area is a good place to find out more about the Coastguard service.</p>

<p>Look around and notice the display boards describing the activities of the MCA....</p> <p>Face north east and click on the leaflets. Face north west and click on the CNIS booklet on the reception desk...</p>	<p>...Click on the display boards for more information</p> <p>... This booklet contains valuable information about the Channel Navigation Information Service (CNIS). Although quite complex it does provide good background information to the activity of the Dover Coastguard Station</p>
